

The Edwin Mary Bloomfield coverlet, dated 1849-50 was acquired by The Quilters' Guild in 2004, driven by a desire to reunite this quilt with a very similar piece also bought by The Guild that year, the Wyatt Coverlet. (see both at www.quiltmuseum.org.uk)

The Bloomfield coverlet, contains a complex pattern of hexagon rosettes and pieced diamonds framed to make a star design at the centre. The plain hexagon in the middle of this design has the inscription embroidered in red 'Edwin. Mary. Bloomfield, 1850'. The centre is surrounded by framed panels of embroidered text, Maltese crosses in a red printed fabric, four large crosses and applied pieces of large-scale floral prints. The wording on the embroidered texts suggest that the coverlet is dedicated to mourning parents. The coverlet is bordered by a heavily glazed furnishing fabric in a trompe-l'oeil design of rope and tassels and edged by a red and white fringe.

The two coverlets (acquired by the vendor from different sources), share common fabrics as well as pieced and appliqué design motifs. Both also include framed panels containing embroidered biblical extracts and pious quotations suggesting a relationship between the two coverlets. Research carried out by BQSG members, Margareta Faust and Carolyn Ferguson, in 2007-9 has revealed a family connection in that Rev William Hindes Wyatt and Edwin Bloomfield married two sisters, Anne and Mary Newson of Great Glemham, Suffolk. William and Anne spent most of their church life in the Sneinton parish in Nottingham. Edwin Bloomfield was a career soldier and the Bloomfields lived in Suffolk after their marriage. We can assume that there would have been social contact between the two families despite a distance of about 150 miles between the two homes.
